Avoid using an abbreviated date on checks and documents, especially legal documents. March 3, 2020 being written as 3/3/20 could easily be modified to 3/3/2018 or 3/3/2022. Scammers could use the change in date to establish an unpaid debt or to attempt to cash an old check. Be safe - use the full year 2020 on your checks and documents.
